Officials' Commissioner Report 2015-2016

The PEISAA member schools, along with the executive, and the provincial sport organization Officials' Associations, continue to have a healthy working relationship. As an Association, we continue to be supportive in helping to build the various Officials' Associations to improve the level of officiating and the number of officials taking part in school sport.

Sports officials represent a critical aspect of the sporting infrastructure, yet those responsible for officiating athletic contests are still leaving sport at an alarming rate. This is more prevalent in our younger officials. (those in their first and second year). Some cases are unavoidable, i.e leaving the province. Almost weekly, we can read articles or stories of officials that are leaving sport. The theme is similar in most, citing that many of our officials leave their sport for reasons due to lack of support, abusive behavior, and or attrition.

Every Officials' Association in PEI is experiencing difficulty in this area. Recruitment is an ongoing and daunting task. The recruitment of younger officials (20-30 yrs) is particularly difficult. Few of the associations would be considered as healthy with respect to the number of officials they are working with. Some associations have shown some growth while others have had a reduction. Every official association sees this as a particular issue; however, they continue on their recruitment quest. Recruitment and retention of officials in the extremities of the province in particular is challenging as always. Member schools can help in identifying and promoting officiating within their community to improve our officiating numbers in all areas of the province, thus reducing some of the financial burden placed on our schools.

An ongoing concern is the number of incidents involving negative behavior directed toward officials during interscholastic play by players, coaches, and spectators. One (1) incident is too many. Member schools must continue to be diligent in promoting fair play, and that these individuals must be responsible and encouraged to be respectful of our officials.

Our sincerest thanks goes out to all officials throughout the province as they provide an incredible service and should be commended for their dedication and valuable contribution to School

Athletics. Our appreciation is also noted to all the member schools and individuals who took on the responsibility of running events at the Provincial Track & Field Championships. It takes an army of volunteers and officials to successfully put on such an event.

Congratulations to the 2016 PEISAA Official of the Year, Tim Hockin from the Rugby community of officials.

FALL SPORT REPORTS

PEISAA Senior Soccer Final Report 2015-2016

1. SPORT PARTICIPATION NUMBERS

Male 14 teams and approximately 240 players *Female* 14 teams and approximately 250 players. We are up one male and one female team this year, both at the A level, which also translates into approximately 40 more participants.

2. GENERAL COMMENTS

The 2015 Fall Soccer Season was a very entertaining and generally each division had its share of competitiveness. The A Men's league had 3 points separate 2^{nd} from 5th, with the 4th place, Col. Gray team winning the championship over the 3rd place Morell team in the championship which was decided by 11 penalty kicks in the championship game. In the A Women's division, 2^{nd} place Charlottetown Rural defeated 1st place Kensington 2-1 in overtime in another exciting final. Again, the standings were very close with 5 points separating 1st and 5th. The AAA Men's league was dominated by Col. Gray as they finished 5 points ahead of 2^{nd} place Bluefield. However, $2^{nd} - 4^{th}$ was separated by 2 points making for an exciting drive to the finals. Col. Gray eventually defeated Rural in the Championship game 4-1, scoring 2 goals in the last 10 minutes. The Charlottetown Rural Women's team capped off an undefeated season winning the championship game over a stubborn TOSH team 3-2. In the 5 – team league, there was a 3 – way tie for 3rd place, again a very competitive league.

In the Friday Night Bronze Medal Games on October 30th, we experienced incredible cold weather, as the wind was blowing hard and the temperatures were dropping. That did not take away from the competitiveness among the teams. All four bronze medal games were decided by 2, or fewer goals. A Men – Souris 4, Rural 3; A Women – Rural 2, Francois Buote 0; AAA Men – Montague 2, Bluefield 1; and AAA Women – Westisle 2, Gray 1.

Many thanks go out to the referee assigners, Cory Deagle in the East and Lincoln Rix and Trevor Bridges in the West. They did a terrific job making sure games were covered. Hats off to our officials for getting to the fields in "light hours," we realize how difficult it is to get to the field at our kick-off times. Other thanks go out to Comfort Inns, UPEI, Holland College, the Town of Cornwall, The Department of Education and Early Childhood, Craig Watson (PEISAA Sport Coordinator), The School Milk Foundation and the many coaches and players who provided many hours of entertaining soccer this fall. I would also like to thank Darryl Boudreau for presenting medals at the bronze medal games at Cornwall.

There were about 10% of the original games scheduled changed for various reasons. I believe this is a lot. There were 97 regular games scheduled and 9 were rescheduled. There needs to be better preparation before attending these meetings as many were due to conflicts with school schedules. There were one or two because we could not get an official assigned to the game, which is also unfortunate.

Getting results still needs to be improved upon. Many evenings, I would text AD's, who would have to text their coaches to get results. Athletic Directors need to be checking in with

these on a more regular basis. Unfortunately, I did have to send emails in the mornings after games to collect results from some schools. This usually resulted in getting the results I was missing fairly quickly.

I did track the cautions and ejections better this year (although I did not receive any more than 2 game sheets this year, so I'm not too sure all cards were reported). There were 60 yellow cards given out, 4 of which were from the female leagues, 56 from the males. As well, we had 8 red cards given out, 1 female and 7 male. These cards did not include play offs.

3. **RECOMMENDATIONS**

1. At the scheduling meeting, I made the mistake of not getting schedules before leaving. This is a necessity to have control on the schedule. Also, AD's need to be more aware of schedule conflicts so we do not have so many rescheduled games.

2. Travel is an issue every year, and with budgets being cut, maybe we could have a few weekend tournaments throughout the season in addition to some regularly scheduled games, to take place of the long drives. For example, teams from the extremities could arrange to play in a central location against each other for two games, saving some travel. This would make for ease of officials as well. Teams could and should be utilizing the Cornwall turf fields for the same reasons. Double headers could be played during the week with two teams of officials covering the games.

3. More consistent reporting of games, similar to last year, but still room for improvement.

4. This was added last year, and the year before, but not addressed:

In speaking to the referee association, there are some concerns with a couple fields that have benches on each side of the field. (Rural and Bluefield) This is not a good situation as one team tends to be sitting with a group of parents and/or students on a set of bleachers. It has been asked of me to recommend each school provide two benches on one side (opposite side from fans) so the teams can occupy one side and the fans the other. This is a FIFA standard and we should follow suit.

5. During the play-offs, we need to have the fields at Cornwall, and possibly UPEI booked for the play-off games leading up to the championship weekend. We had many conflicts (especially with field hockey). Also, on Monday of that week this year we had 3 games in the Charlottetown area, and Wednesday, we had 5, so the use of the turf fields would allow games to start at a reasonable time and allow us to have 3 officials at each game.

Rural and Gray win sweep PEISAA Senior Soccer Championships

The PEI School Athletic Association held its soccer championships on Saturday at UPEI and Cornwall.

In AAA Men's action at UPEI, Rural took an early lead in the opening minutes of the first half on a goal by Isaac Costain. Col. Gray clawed back and scored two goals from Yousef Seafour and Mon Son Aung to lead the Championship game going into the break. In the second half, the teams traded several chances but it with rural pressing for the equalizer, Deepak Khanal and Matthurne Carr Rollitt managed to score a goal apiece in the final minutes of the game to claim their second championship in three years. The championship capped off a successful for Gray year as they won tournaments in Rothesay, NB and their own Wall of Fame Cup.

In AAA Women's Championship action Rural took a 1-0 lead half way through the first half on a goal from Kelly McCardle. That goal would hold up until early in the second half when McCardle would score again to put Rural up 2-0 and surely put the game safely in hand. However, a Feisty Three Oaks team would battle back. Three Oaks' Abi Perry and Kate Steel would score two goals 8 minutes apart in the last 15 minutes to tie the game. However, Rural did not want to spoil an undefeated season and replied within a minute with a goal from Maddie Hurley with 7 minutes remaining in regulation time. TOSh pressed hard for the equalizer, but a steady Rural defense was able to hold on to win the AAA Championship.

In the A Men's championship game, Morell's Spencer Compton put the Marlins ahead mid way through the first half. Before the end of the first half, Col. Gray's Prackish Bhandari tied the game. In the second half, both teams traded several chances and keepers Kier Warren (Gray) and Alex Hardwick (Morell) came up with many saves to take the game to overtime. 30 additional minutes of overtime decided nothing so the teams went to penalty kicks. In soccer every player must attempt to score before starting at the first again. After all 10 players shot, the score was still tied and it came down to keeper vs. keeper. In the end Kier Warren was able to score, then make the save to preserve the Gold Medal for Gray.

In the A Women's championship game, Rural was looking to take back the Gold medal that was taken from their reach in the last minute of play last year. This year's opponents would be the Kensington ladies. At half time and several chances from both teams, the score remained at 0 - 0. 13 minutes into the second half, KISH's Rachel Green score to give the number one ranked Kensington girls the lead. It wasn't until 12 minutes left in regulation time that Rural's Jess Redmond scored to even the match at 1 and send the game into overtime. The first half of overtime decided nothing, however, at the 110 minute of the game Redmond struck again for Rural. Rural were able to hold off a strong KISH team for the last 10 minutes of overtime and capture the gold.

The Bronze medal games were played at Cornwall and Charlottetown Rural on a windy and cold Friday evening.

A Women's Montague defeated Francois Buote 2-0. Montague's goals were both scored by Sarah MacVarish, while Martha Cudmore recorded the shutout. Francois Buote's keeper was Anna Fernandell.

In the A Men's bronze medal game, Souris defeated Rural 4-3 in an exciting finish. The teams were tied at 1-1 at the half on goals by Kegan Bradley for Rural and Matthew MacInnis for Souris just before the half. There were no goals in the second half until half way through the half. Rural went up 2-1 on a goal by Brandon MacDonald, and Souris' Ryan Acorn replied 2 minutes later to tie the game. 3 minutes later Matthew MacInnis put Souris ahead 3-2, only to have Rural tie it again with two minutes left in the game. In added time, Souris scored the deciding goal off the foot of MacInnis again to seal the Bronze medal and the hat trick for MacInnis.

In AAA Women's bronze medal action, Westisle defeated Gray 2-1. Westisle took a 2-0 lead over the defending champion Colonels on goals by Maddy Shea and Martina Ellis. Gray pressed throughout the game, but Westisle keeper, Julia O'Halloran kept Westisle in the game. Late in the second half, Sarah Victor cut the Westisle lead in half, and Gray continued to press, but it was not to be.

In the AAA Men's bronze medal game, Montague defeated Bluefield 2-1. Bluefield led 1-0 at the half on a very windy and cold night at the Cornwall Soccer turf. Scoring for Bluefield was Gavin MacAleer early in the half. In the second half, with the wind on their back, Montague began to push and was rewarded with a goal off the foot of Donovan Beers. The teams traded chances all second half until Zach Lund finished a great individual effort with 10 minutes left in the game to seal the victory.

4. GENERAL COMMENTS: For the second year, the 2014 midget and high school field hockey had excellent weather for league play. 5. **RECOMMENDATIONS**

5. The recommendation from 2012 high school all-star meeting was to schedule the 2013 high school and midget quarter final games so that the team winning would have a school day to practice was well received. 4. General Comments

The Pre Novice - Midget Cross Country season ended with the 2015 Source for Sports Provincial Cross Country Championship at Mill River Provincial Park on Saturday, October 15th. 4. Continue to encourage the Holland College 1st year golf administration class to help facilitate the championship


5. All qualifying tournaments must to be played on Tuesday, Thursdays and Saturdays

WINTER SPORT REPORTS

PEISAA Senior Basketball Final Report 2015-2016

General comments:

Having survived the winter of 2014/15 the PEI high schools returned to normalcy this year. Play began in late November as usual and ran through until early March, finishing on the 8th with the AAA championships.

The number of teams was consistent with the previous year's entries, featuring thirty teams and approximately three hundred and sixty players.

Once again the Athletic Directors created a system that allowed for flexibility in scheduling as every team was free to schedule with any other. Again teams were asked to try to schedule ten or more games with five or more opponents. Once again this proved difficult as coaches and ADs were reluctant to create obviously unbalanced contests against opposition who might be several positions removed from them in the rankings.

The same seeding committee was in place with the addition of our sport coordinator, Craig Watson. He decided to give it a whirl so that he would become familiar with the deliberations of the committee's members. Walter MacEwen, SAA sport mentor, Chris Huggan, UPEI athletic director and I returned for another season.

It is important that the teams from our respective schools, schedule multiple opponents in multiple contests so that there is ample information available for the seeding committee to make accurate assessments. In some years in some segments of the rankings five opponents may be too large a number to demand.

It seems that there is an agreement among the ADs that the current format for playoffs is a good one. The key component is that quarter-final losers drop down a division and become the top seeds in the lower division. It's not a perfect system but there seems to be consensus that for now it is the best arrangement.

So again there was quarter-final, semi-final and championship/ bronze medal action in all six divisions. The quarters were hosted by the better ranked team in each case. The A semi-finals and medal matches were hosted again by CRHS. Play at the AA level was hosted by Colonel Gray and the AAA action, semis and medal games took place at UPEI.

All stars were chosen by the coaches. The ADs decided to pass on the all-star game concept.

Commissioner's Recommendations:

- 1. UPEI remains the preferred site for AAA play-off action. Capacity, policing and washroom considerations are the selling points.
- 2. Security was better at this year's AAA event.
- 3. Recommend a similar set-up for league and playoff action.
- 4. The website is a work in progress. There is room for improvement. This is despite the incredible work done by Walter MacEwen. He would say that the website needs to be better promoted from the inside by schools.
- 5. Again the markings on the floor are not current. Are we going to recommend something? It may be a project over time but we should not miss any opportunities to upgrade.
- 6. We need to work together to support young officials and their place in our game.

General Comments:

Overall, I thought the midget basketball season ran very smoothly. Game sheets were faxed to me in a timely manner. The issue of "no zone" defence seemed to be less of a concern this season with most coaches abiding to the agreement. There were a few complaints about coaches using illegal defence prior to the playoffs. Officials on the floor are not going to police this which leaves coaches frustrated when there is no course of action until after the game has been played. This is a legitimate concern but there doesn't seem to be an answer for it. Everybody has to play by the same rules in order for everyone to feel that sense of fairness.

A big thank you goes out to Tyler Read for hosting the "A" championships at Morell High and Stanley Chaisson for hosting the "AA" tournament at Kensington Intermediate-High School. Both tournaments went off on time and without incident.

Recommendations:


- 1. Prior to the start of the basketball season, continue to offer a clinic for coaches to demonstrate what is a legal man-to-man defense and what is considered a zone defense.
- 2. AD's continue to submit the actual game sheet to the commissioner following a home game. An "incident report form" should also be made available to coaches and referees so they can note any incidents in the game the commissioner should be aware of. Incidents could include player/coach conduct, illegal defence and all technical and unsportsmanlike fouls should be noted. What you consider an isolated incident could be a common occurance.
- **3.** AD's attending the scheduling meeting must have a clear picture of what divisions their teams belong in and be ready to **commit to a schedule**. Having knowledge of exams, concerts, school trips, player commitment, etc that will impact their schedule is also a must so once the schedule is set minimal changes have to be made.

4. General Comments

The 2016 school gymnastics season ended on Saturday, February 20th with the PEI School Athletic Association Provincial Gymnastics Championship at Kensington Intermediate Senior High School. The championship was hosted by St. Louis Elementary School.

Provincial team titles: Pre-Novice Boys- L M Montgomery Elementary, Pre-Novice Girls-Spring Park Elementary - Novice Girls- West Kent Elementary, Novice Boys- Montague Consolidated, Bantam Girls - Montague Intermediate and Midget Girls- Montague Intermediate. Individual awards were also given to the top six vault /floor routines and top ten all around. A total of 304 gymnasts participated at this year's event. This was an increase of 19 gymnasts from last year. The biggest drop was with the novice girl's category - 11. We had a total of 28 different schools from across PEI participate.

On Saturday morning the competition started at 9:00 am and finished ahead of time. A total of 140 gymnasts participated with 90 Pre-Novice Girls and 50 Pre-Novice Boys. Increase of 10 gymnasts.

On Saturday afternoon, another big crowd watched 123 gymnasts perform in the Novice boys and Novice girl's categories, (51 Novice boys and 72 Novice girls). Same total as last year.

The late afternoon competition had a total of 41 gymnasts participate in Bantam Boys, Bantam Girls, and Midget Girls categories, 7 Bantam Boys, 22 Bantam Girls and 12 Midget Girls. This was an increase of 9 from last year's total.

All information and results were posted in the two local papers and two radio stations. The media coverage before and after was very good. All results were circulated to all the media, schools and on our SAA website within days of our championship.

We had a total of 450 paid spectators. This was an increase of 29 paid spectators.

Our computer program which calculated the results came through for us again. Within minutes of the end of both competitions, the results were handed out. I would like to thank you Brian Alain once again for helping us with the results and registration.

Thank you to Leisa Nogler and Robyn MacDonald who helped with the presentation of all our awards.

I would like to say a special thank you to Craig Watson and the SAA Executive for your continuous support in helping with the championship and a special thank you to Rob Connell for his help in securing one janitor for the weekend.

I would also like to thank Principal Donald Milligan and Phy. Ed. Teacher Stan Chaisson for all their help and continuous support. Thank you for allowing us to use your fine facility to host our Provincial Championship. It is very much appreciated.

We can't forget PEI School milk Foundation for their continuous support and of course for the free chocolate milk for all the competitors.

Thank you to all the Unit managers for hosting their own zone competitions and sending me all the results on time. It was greatly appreciated. It's always a pleasure to work with such dedicated professionals. Great job!

5. **Recommendations for improving the sport:**

- 1. Educate coaches to the new judging system coming next year in PEISAA Gymnastics. The Junior Olympic Program adopted by Gymnastics PEI is already here and we need to implement the new deductions to get in line with our judges in the sport.
- 2. Go over the new JO Program and see if we could adopt new skills for our students to use next year.
- 3. Look at new a new way of competing vault. Look at Junior Olympic Program vaulting system.
- 4. Bring coaches together at a PD Day to discuss what they want our Championship to look like: participation vs. competitive.
- 5. Review age classification Midget categories.
- 6. Do we want to break up a first place tie for team competition?



PEISAA Wrestling Final Report 2015-2016

1. General Comments

The 2016 PEISAA Wrestling Championships were held on Friday evening for the Bantam, Midget and Senior divisions and on Saturday for the Novice competitors. The venue was Montague Regional High School's gymnasium and the tournament was run on three mats on Friday and on two mats on Saturday.

The on-mat official situation was strong. We had four nationally ranked officials and two provincial stream officials. Our senior officials provided guidance, mentoring the newer and less experienced officials. The officials went out of their way to ensure the athletes were safe and interacted w/ the athletes, allowing them to feel at ease. I was not made aware of any serious injuries although one of my wrestlers required two stitches in his ear for a very unusual tear / cut! The on-site medical staff from Sports Center Physio were top notch.

Parents, friends and former wrestlers from the Montague schools' wrestling community were top notch volunteers and are quite knowledgeable about the sport of wrestling. Our minor officials, score keepers, timers and hosts allowed for a very smoothly run event. We had multiple volunteers from the MRHS Leadership class and Grade 10 Phys Ed classes, who were excellent. Volunteers run this sport and, as commissioner and coach, I can't thank them enough.

Spectators and parents of school wrestling are becoming more accustomed to staying in the bleachers and/or viewing areas and staying off the mats, although they do not like being asked to sit down or stay off the competition floor! With increased participation for Friday's competition, there were some issues w/ crowding. On Saturday, with the event on two mats, we were able to pull out the second set of bleachers. Parents and other spectators on the floor and wrestling mats creates several problems – crowding, safety concerns, competition anxiety in the wrestlers, issues w/ outdoor footwear on their wooden gymnasium floor and inability to view what's actually happening! Overall, I was very pleased with the flow of the event and MRHS is an ideal venue. The idea of putting one mat in the cafeteria was discussed, but it can create problems for coaches, having to run between two areas.

Participation numbers at the intermediate and senior high grew from last year, with the addition of Birchwood and ME Callaghan. East Wiltshire also brought large team. This is very encouraging. Both East Wiltshire and ME Callaghan received support from Wrestling PEI with the loan of a partial mat, enabling them to grow their program. Technical expertise by the way of a guest coach was offered at several PEI schools this season, with financial support from

Wrestling Canada Lutte. There continues to be a keen interest in developing a Pre-Novice division and including them at an age appropriate level of competition in PEISAA competition.

The biggest challenge is to continue to develop the sport into the Intermediate / Senior high schools. Having a teacher / coach w/in the school as well as adequate gym / cafeteria practice time seems to determine the longevity and success of a program and helps to retain athletes. Unfortunately, when that teacher leaves the school or if gym time is not made available, the program dies.

2. Recommendations

Update on Recommendations from 2014 – 2015 Season

Based on last year's recommendations, we accomplished 3 of my 6 goals: Grade 9s who are students at an intermediate school were sanctioned to complete in NBIAA events for the first time in approximately 10 years, we had our first NCCP coaching course in recent memory in the fall of 2015 and we continued to have school teams wrestle past the provincials as a club and attend local events.

Recommendations for 2016-2107 Season

- 1. Add Pre-Novice division (modified rules, grouped weights)
- 2. Wrestling Season: consider changing the season for Bantam, Midget, Senior to November February and have provincials at the end of February, allowing for those athletes to have an opportunity to compete at NBIAA and NSSAF events and continue with a club when the school season is over. We would look to keep Pre-Novice and Novice as is, so as not to disrupt the PEISAA Gymnastics season. This format would negatively impact programs currently running at consolidated schools (Belfast, Southern Kings, Gulf Shore, possibly others) and requires more discussion. As a first step, I'd like to see teams start practices sooner (before Christmas) and all Zone qualifiers take place earlier (before March Break).
- 3. Review the Novice weight classes and make changes to reflect participation numbers and ensure appropriate gaps between classes.
- Have the Midget (Gr 9/10) and Senior (Gr 11/12) weight classes mirror the weight classes at the national level. From Wrestling Canada Lutte: Midget = Cadet; Senior = Juvenile.
- 5. Encourage more girls to continue wrestling into intermediate school by offering a camp in the fall or sometime in January 2017 for girls only.

- 6. Offer coaching development opportunities in Oct / Nov 2016 for interested teachers and members of the community to develop school wrestling (target area: Western PEI and elementary schools in Charlottetown and Summerside).
- 7. Continue to encourage schools to become clubs and participate in the PEI Open, NB Open, NS Open and the Maritime Wrestling Festival (Moncton, NB). In particular, the PEI Open (March / April) and the Maritime Wrestling Festival (end of April in Moncton) and Canada East Wrestling Festival are a perfect complement to what's already happening on PEI. This April, Tignish Elementary, Gulf Shore and East Wiltshire joined teams from the Montague and Charlottetown areas at the Maritime Wrestling Festival, demonstrating growth in our program. These connections were made at the Provincials!
- Continue to participate in NBIAA sanctioned high school tournaments in 2016 2017, allowing grade 9 wrestlers to join their feeder high school's wrestling team to take part and continue to participate in NSSAF sanctioned junior / senior high school tournaments. I would like to see our new school teams at this level be represented at the off Island events in 2016 2017.
- 9. Have more schools attend PEI Open, making it a part of the PEISAA Wrestling season. In 2016, PEI Open and Provincials were only one week apart (due to dates of Easter and March Break). It is best if these events are at least two weeks apart and the calendar for 2017 will allow this to take place.
- 10. Individual sanction requests for off Island events be submitted to PEISAA no later than 4 weeks prior to the event (6 weeks preferred).

4. GENERAL COMMENTS

The PEISAA provincial badminton championships were held on Friday April 29 and Saturday April 30, at 4 Charlottetown and area locations.

Championship titles in novice, bantam, midget, juvenile and senior boys and girls' categories were all up for grabs in singles, doubles and mixed play. Most of our Island schools were represented in zone playoffs, with the top two from the four zones advancing to the provincials.

Connor Jinks from Rural was victorious in senior boy's singles defeating Owen Hall from Three Oaks 21-14 and 21-13 to win the provincial title. Logan MacDougall of Three Oaks defeated Iassc Knox of Westisle 21-17 and 21-19 to claim the senior boys bronze medal. In doubles action Owen Hall and Logan MacDougall from TOSH defeated Jonah Wilton and Mark Morrison from Montague 21-16 and 21-18. The bronze medal was won by Rural. Connor Jinks and Joel Arsenault defeated Alex MacFadyen and Brolin Turner from Three Oaks 21-17 and 21-1. With a second and third in singles, a first in doubles and a fourth in doubles, Three Oaks easily won the provincial title with 11 points.

In girls' action, Kelsey MacKinnon of Three Oaks defeated another Three Oaks player, Nikki Arsenault 21-18 and 22-20 to win the senior girls provincial singles championship. Jenna Mae Ellsworth of Gray defeated Adele Arsenault of Evangeline 21-19, 19-21 and 21-15 to claim the bronze medal in singles. Keirstyn Hamlin and Kelsey MacKinnon defeated Jenna Mae Ellsworth and Jada Yeo of Gray 21-17 and 21-19 to win the senior girls doubles championship. Rickilee MacLeod and Maddie Thibodeau of Westisle defeated Annika Weibe and Sophia Blanchard of Gray 21-18 and 21-17 to claim the bronze medal. Three Oaks won the provincial championship with a total of 13 points.

Senior Mixed Doubles champions this year were Nonie Lyon and Josh Niyon from Westisle. They defeated Chelsey Wright and Donavan Wyand of Bluefield 21-14 and 21-16. Kristen Whiteway and Colton Morris from Montague defeated Bethany MacKenzie and Jake Banks from Montague 21-18 and 22- 20 to win the bronze medal. Westisle wins the senior mixed provincial title with 5 points.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS FOR IMPROVING SPORT

This year was the first year for regional qualifiers in the juvenile and senior divisions. The four zones were amalgamated into two regions (east and west). This proved to be a difficult task as all four zones ran their badminton qualifiers quite differently in the past. With the help of a working group and very dedicated Athletic Directors and coaches, it worked very well. All schools involved liked the concept of regionals but there is still some changes needed on the format and the times to keep everyone happy. The next time the high school Athletic Directors are together I will have a chance to sit with them and work on a revamped schedule for next year. Having players report scores if they were going to a third game, worked very well again this year. Teams also reported scores to me on Saturday. It is great to see that the players are aware of how important scores are.

The goal will be to use UPEI again next year. This way we can have all players in one location for the finals and it will enhance our championship. Spectator seating is a bit of an issue as parents are asked to stand up on the track to watch players. I like how it works since all parents and spectators are upstairs and away from the competition. I can see how this is difficult if you are a parent there for the day and have to stand. I will look to see if I can find any other solutions to help out with seating.

Lastly, there needs to be a review of championship points as there is still too many ties for championships each year. I hope that the AD's can help me out when we meet to discuss regionals for next year.

We lost Black Knight as a sponsor and hope to get Yonex aboard for next year. Yonex has a superior product and we hope to have them come aboard as a sponsor.

PEISAA Rugby Final Report 2015-2016

General Comments:

It was my pleasure to try to fill the gap left by Ryan Lloyd, experimenting with a year of teaching abroad in China. It is also with pleasure that I inform you that Ryan hopes to be available again next spring.

It was a very competitive and yet challenging year last year for rugby in our province. Old man winter had blasted our Island and the fields were late recovering. This caused numerous serious delays in getting going in the spring of 2015. This was not the case this year. The weather was our ally and we were ahead of schedule from one end of the island to the other. Perhaps because of this, schools tried to forge ahead on all fronts.

Our scheduling/ planning meeting was perhaps a few days premature. It seemed that numbers were still somewhat up in the air as the ADs were trying to put together the Master Plan for the spring. This may have contributed to some hurried restructuring later on.

Right from the get-go Bluefield asked for permission to play down a level with their senior men's team. Bluefield's experienced and rugby-wise AD Darryl Boudreau felt that his group had barely survived the previous year. He proposed a consolidation year might work wonders for the school's men's program.

For the sake of the sport, Charlottetown Rural offered to try to compete at the AA level with the Bobcats. Rural and Bluefield were the only entries. It was evident from the start that this was a very large and difficult task. The teams had agreed to play four games however and so it was going to be a long and arduous road for the Raiders.

With Bluefield out of the mix there were only five mens AAA teams. Westisle was one of them. When the Wolverines attempted a trip to western Canada, the behavior of some team members proved costly. Several were suspended and the school was forced to suspend its entry for this season.
